This is an annual license and must be purchased each year. Dog license are valid from January 1 to December 31.

LICENSE RATES ARE FOR EACH DOG: Male & Female \$8.50 Neutered Male & Spayed Female \$3.50

ANYONE THAT HAS 4 OR MORE DOGS ARE REQUIRED TO PURCHASE A KENNEL LICENSE OR MULTIPLE DOG LICENSE

Multiple Dog License (Up to 12) \$36.50

After April 1 there is a \$5.00 late fee for each pet. Owners must present their RABIES VACCINATION CERTIFICATE that their dog is vaccinated against rabies by a veterinarian before the dog can be licensed. I also need the Pet Owners phone number for Dog license report sent to the Brown County Clerk's Office. THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY FOLLOWED!!!!!
